

Paradigm shift

Paradigm shifts are occurring in the Signal Regiment at the beginning of the new century. Signal Regiment enlisted soldiers are taking on new roles. The Regiment is working with agencies (like the Forest Service) that it has never worked with before on joint efforts, such as providing communications for the Los Padres National Forest firefighting efforts. Some training programs are focusing on working with commercial-off-the-shelf equipment. The National Guard is responsible for several rotations as the Stabilization Force in Bosnia; Guard Signal units will support these rotations. Voice and data requirements are reversing. This edition of *Army Communicator* looks at these paradigm shifts.
