NATIONAL TAKE BACK INITIATIVE

Friday, 29 April 2016 – 1200 to 1600 hours

Due to the overwhelming success of previous events, DEA has scheduled the sixth National Prescription Drug Take Back Day. Fort Gordon will participate in the campaign by sponsoring a turn in site on the second floor (near the pharmacy) of the Dwight D. Eisenhower Medical Center **Friday, 29 April 2016 from 1200 to 1600 hours**. This is a great opportunity for those who have accumulated unwanted, unused prescription or over the counter drugs to safely dispose of them.

Further info:

- Controlled (those substances which require a doctor's prescription) non-controlled, and over the counter substances may be collected.
- This program is anonymous and every effort will be made to protect the anonymity of participants. No questions or requests for identification will be made.
- All participants must retain possession of their own medication during the surrender process. Law enforcement personnel should not handle the medications at any time.
- Participants may dispose of medication in its original container, or by removing the medication from its container and disposing of it directly into the disposal box. If an original container is submitted, the individual should remove any identifying information from the prescription label.
- All solid dosage pharmaceutical product and liquids in consumer containers may be accepted. Liquid products, such as cough syrup, should remain sealed in their original container. The depositor should ensure the cap is tightly sealed to prevent leakage.

Items that **cannot** be turned in:

- a) Syringes, Intra-venous solutions, injectibles.
- b) Illicit substances such as marijuana or methamphetamine are not a part of this initiative, and should not be placed in collection containers.
