MEMORANDUM FOR ALL FORT GORDON TENANT UNITS

SUBJECT: Garrison Commander's Policy Memorandum No. 36—Composite Risk Management Signature Policy

1. References.
 - a. AR 385-10, The Army Safety Program
 - b. IMCOM Regulation 385-10, Safety Program
 - c. DA Pam 385-30, Mishap Risk Management
2. Purpose. To establish a policy that supports and implements references 1 a – c.
3. Applicability. This policy applies to all personnel assigned to the Fort Gordon tenant units.
4. Background. Composite Risk Management (CRM) is the primary technique to be used for accident prevention with the Army. CRM is an analytical technique that is used to systematically assess, eliminate, or reduce the risk associated with any operation, action, or activity. Risk decision authority is based upon the residual risk of an activity **after** application of control measures.
5. Responsibilities. Approving authority:
 - a. **Extremely high risk** – Fort Gordon units planning an operation with a residual risk level of Extremely High will forward their request through the Garrison Commander to the Senior Mission Commander.
 - b. **High risk** – Colonel, Brigade Commander or equivalent for all Fort Gordon Garrison units.
 - c. **Medium risk** – Lieutenant Colonel, Battalion Commander or equivalent.
 - d. **Low risk** – Any commissioned officer, E-8 and above, and GS-11 and above.
