SUBJECT: Installation Food Service Policy Memorandum No. 57 – Garrison Commander's Best Dining Facility Award Program

1. Purpose: This memorandum provides guidance for participation in and nomination of representatives to the Garrison Commander's Best Dining Facility Awards Program.
2. References:
 - a. AR 30-22, 10 May 05, Army Food Program.
 - b. DA Pam 30-22, 3 Jan 07, Operating Procedures for the Army Food Program.
3. Responsibilities:
 - a. The Fort Gordon Installation Food Service will:
 - (1) Provide policy guidance for development and conduct of the Installation Garrison Commander's Best Dining Facility Awards Program for Excellence in Army Food Service.
 - (2) Establish specific standards for evaluation in all categories of the competition. Criteria used should further the objectives of the Army Food Service Program set forth in AR 30-22 and DA Pam 30-22.
 - (3) Conduct unannounced evaluations using the installation food service general purpose checklist and select the winner based on the highest score. Dining facilities must achieve a minimum score of 90% during the evaluation to be eligible for the award.
 - (4) Select the competitors winning the most quarterly evaluations for the Garrison Commander's Best Dining Facility Awards Program for the Year. In the event of a tie, the installation will evaluate the facilities to determine only one winner for the year.
 - (5) The Installation Food Program Manager will announce winners following evaluations. The winners will be recognized in an appropriate installation ceremony.

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(6) Select a dining facility for participation in the IMCOM-Southeast phase of the competition.

4. Participation:

a. The Garrison Commander's Awards Program for Excellence in Army Food Service is mandatory for all dining facilities.

b. Contractor-operated dining facilities are included in all levels of competition.

c. The Garrison Commander's Awards Program will determine which participants are going to compete in the Philip A. Connelly Award Program.
