MEMORANDUM FOR ALL MILITARY AND CIVILIAN PERSONNEL

SUBJECT: Garrison Commander's Policy Memorandum No. 71 - Material Storage Compliance with Industrial Stormwater Permit

1. Chemical and material storage will be performed by utilization of the Hazardous Materials Control Center (HMCC). Exceptions to this policy require written approval by the Director of Public Works (DPW).
2. Chemical and material storage on the installation is covered by the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit GAR000000, issued by the State of Georgia. The permit is a requirement of the Georgia Water Quality Control Act 391-3-6, the Federal Clean Water Act, and Army Regulation 200-1. The State and Federal Acts require permitting of Stormwater Industrial Activities. Chemical and material storage requires proactive management to comply with the conditions of the permit. Chemicals and materials stored in the outside environment will cause contaminated stormwater runoff. The centralization of hazardous material and water priority chemicals to the HMCC will reduce the exposure to stormwater and limit surface water impacts.
3. Inventory of such materials is also a permit requirement. Centralized management will streamline compliance with this permit condition as it will reduce waste stream generation, cost to the installation, and will ensure compliance with the other regulations such as Emergency Planning Community Right to Know Act, Affirmative Procurement, Solid Waste, and Hazardous Materials Control.
