MEMORIAL DAY ACTIVITIES

FORT GORDON, GA – Fort Gordon speakers, band, color guard and military units are set to participate in Memorial Day observances in the Augusta-Aiken area.

The Aiken Marine Corps League Memorial Day parade is Saturday, May 28, with Brigadier General W. Bryan Gamble, commanding general, Dwight D. Eisenhower Army Medical Center as parade marshal. The parade features support from the Fort Gordon joint service color guard, along with the U.S. Navy Information Operations Command, the 15th Signal Brigade and the Wounded Warriors Transition Unit from Fort Gordon. The parade begins at 1 p.m. on Laurens Street.

Major General Alan Lynn, commanding general, U.S. Army Signal Center of Excellence and Fort Gordon, will be guest speaker for Columbia County's Red, White and Blue celebration at 7 p.m. Saturday, May 28 at the Amphitheater, Ronald Reagan Drive. The U.S. Army Signal Corps Band and color guard will take part in the ceremony.

Major General Alan Lynn will also be guest speaker at the Georgia War Veterans Nursing Home on 15th Street at 9 a.m. Monday, May 30. The Signal Corps Band, color guard and firing squad will participate.

The Fort Gordon color guard and band will take part in the Bellevue Memorial Gardens Cemetery observance on Memorial Day at 10 a.m. Monday, May 30 on

Wrightsboro Road in Grovetown. Colonel Jeffrey Lepak, assigned to the Fort Gordon commanding general's staff, will be the guest speaker.

Colonel Glenn Kennedy, Fort Gordon Garrison Commander, will speak at the CSRA Veterans Memorial Day Ceremony at the Monument of All Wars on 4th and Broad Streets, 11 a.m. Monday, May 30. Also participating in the ceremony will be the Fort Gordon color guard.

A concert of patriotic music to celebrate Memorial Day will take place at the Riverwalk Amphitheater, downtown Augusta at 7 p.m., Monday, May 30. The event will feature the Augusta Concert Band, which includes members of the U.S. Army Signal Corps Band. Fort Gordon's Colonel D.J. Reyes is the guest speaker.

Memorial Day honors the men and women killed or missing in action in all wars fought by the United States.
